While travelling east on Gladstone, the night of March 21st, at about 8:15 P.M., I stopped for a traffic light at Linwood, behind a police car. As they waited for the light to change, the officers saw two men approaching the corner to cross Gladstone, going north. The officers alighted from their car, intercepted the men, and searched them.

At this point, I got out of my car and asked the officers the reason for the search. Officer #757, driver of patrol car #6452492, in a rude, uncivil and menacing manner, sought to intimidate me, demanding what I wanted to know for. I declard that they were violating the Constitutional rights of the two men. The officers stated that they had a right to stop and search anyone whom they suspected of a crime, and that I was interferring with their duties, as they were investigating a complaint of an apartment burglary. We exchanged words sharply, and I stated that I was not trying to interfere with justice, but rather that I was trying to uphold it and they were ignoring these Men's Constitutional rights because they are Negroes.
