SUMMARY OF COMPLAINT: Subjects states while he was traveling east on Gladstone, the night of March 21st, about 8:15P.M., he stopped for a traffic light at Linwood, behind a police car. As they waited for the light to change, the officers saw two men approaching the corner to cross Gladstone, going north. The officers alighted from their car, intercepted the men and searched them.

At this point, subject got out of his car and asked the officers the reason for the search of the two men. Officer # 757, driver of patrol car # 6452492, in a rude, uncivil and menacing manner, sought to intimidate Mrs. Glover, demanding what did he want to know for. I declared that they were violating the Constitutional rights of the two men. The officers stated that they had a right to stop and search anyone whom they suspected of a crime and that he was interfering with their duties, as they were investigating a complaint of an apartment burglary.
