Fatal shooting of Cynthia Scott, 24/c/f, of Detroit, at 3:05 A. M., July 5, 1963,

at John R. & Edmund Streets, Detroit.

Questioned by Mr. Silverman as follows:

- You name is Robert C. Marshall?
- A Yes, sir.
- And you are a Patrolman, assigned to the First Precinct, Detroit Police Department?
- A Yes, I am.
- Q My name is Max M. Silverman. I am an Assistant Prosecuting

Attorney, acting under the direction of Samuel H. Olsen, Prosecuting Attorney for Wayne County. I want to ask you some questions about something that happened early this morning. Do you want to answer my questions? Yes, sir. A Q Now, what was the duty you were on last night? We were on our regular scout ---A [Interposing] Not "we" -- you? Q Myself -- I was on regular -- my regular assignment -- Scout 1-3. Q Who was your partner? A Patrolman Theodore Spicher. Q Did you, sometime around 3 o'clock this morning, m ake an arrest? Yes, sir, we did. A Whom did you arrest? Q Frances Jones. A What did you arrest her for? Q A Disorderly person, investigation. Q And after you placed her under arrest did you put her in the scout car? A Yes, we did. Q Were you on the way to headquarters with her? Yes. A On the way did something happen? Q - 2 -

Yes, sir. A What happened? Q I observed a known colored prostitute, to myself, walking on A John R. towards Headquarters, in the direction we were going, and I asked Ted to pull over andwe would question them. She was walking with another man, Q Did you see anything in her hand? As we approached, I noticed she had some paper money clutched A in her hand, so -- I was sitting on the passenger side at the time. So, Patrolman Spicher stopped at the curb; I got out of the car and went over -- rather, Ted got out of the car and went over and began questioning the couple -- the man and the girl, and I observed through the left window that the man became very indignant, staing in effect that we couldn't take the girl; that the girl was his girlfriend and so forth and so on, and at that time I got out of the car and walked around, and I took the man and put him up against the buildings and started talking to him while Patrolman Spicher took the girl toward the car to effect this arrest. Did you search this man? Q No, sir, Patrolman Spicher had searched the man prior to my getting out of the car. What did you observe or hear as Patrolman Spicher was taking her to the car?

Well, as I was talking to the man, I heard Patrolman Spicher A cry out -- what he said in effect I couldn't say -- I just heard him holler as if he was hurt, and I turned and I saw the girl run past him -- he backed off and then he ran after her. As they reached across the street -- he had the girl more or less headed off -- the girl had gotten past him again and she was swinging back and forth at him with the knife in her hand. Now, I will show you this jack knife, to which is attached evidence property tag #17878, and ask you if you saw that before? Yes, sir, that's the knife. A Where did you see it? Q In the girl's hand. A Was the blade open? Q Yes, sir, it was. A Did yo u see her swinging --Q. [Interposing] At Patrolman Spicher with it, yes, sir. A All right. Did you later get a chance to see whether Q Patrolman Spicher -- did you see whether he had been cut? Yes, sir, he had a cut on his left hand. A Now, as she ran away from there, did anybody fire any Q shots? As she passed Patrolman Spicher -- she had gotten no more A than five feet past, he fired two shots -- the girl kept - 4 -

going and all of a sudden she slowed down and turned --- he fired a third shot and she fell. Q As she started to turn, did she still have the knife in her hand? Yes, sir. A Was she coming towards Patrolman Spicher at that time? She half turned -- what her intentions were I couldn't tell, but she had half turned. She still had the knife? Q With the knife in front of her -- I ran up to her and as I A got to her, I reached down, attempting to take the knife from her and she swung the knife at me and cut through my shirt, so I stepped back. Q Were you wearing the same shirt you are now wearing? Yes, sir. A Which arm -- which sleeve was cut? Q Left sleeve [indicating]. A I notice a cut on your left sleeve -- is that the result of Q her cutting at you with the knife? Yes, sir. A I will show you this Detroit Police Department photograph Q #215218 and ask you if you recognize that girl? Yes, sir, that's the girl. A Is that the girl Patrolman Spicher was placing under Q arrest? - 5 -

A Yes, sir. Is that the girl that out him? Q Yes, sir. A Is that the girl he shot? Q Yes, sir, it is. MR. SILVERMAN: Thank you; that's all. [Witness excused and statement concluded at 6:33 O'clock A.
