

INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM SPECIAL INVESTIGATION BUREAU SOURCE



On December 6, 1967, at approximately 8:00 P.M. Source attended a business meeting of the Detroit Committee to End the War in Vietnam (DCEWV). The meeting was held at the DCEWV offices located at 1101 W. Warren and was attended by 15 to 20 white males and females. Chairman of the meeting was a white male, 20, 5'10", slim, dark brown hair, mustache and beard (under chin and on nack only). This man's first name was Dave, last name unknown.

Matters discussed during the meeting are as follows: December 7th. and 8th., 1967, members are to hand out leaflets ("Who Really Has Guts", copies attached) at the Fort Wayne Induction Center beginning at 5:30 A.M. and are going to attempt to enter the Fort. One member is to dress in a suit to facilitate his entry into the Fort.

December 8, 1967, plans for the parade starting at 4:00 P.M. from Clark Park were discussed and it was indicated that torches would be carried. The DCEWV will have a number of members wearing armbands and are to be monitors, monitors are to keep marchers informed as to police activity and also any trouble that may arise from citizens along the parade route. EVELYN KIRSH who was not present at the meeting is to be in charge of the monitors. The parade is expected to contain 200 to 300 participants.

GORDON FOX, Chairman of the High School Mobilisation Committee discussed plans for a National Meeting of all high school mobilisation groups and indicated he was going to attempt to have this National Meeting in Detroit.

The last topic of discussion was how the demonstrators in New York were controlled by the police by breaking the demonstrators into small groups and that in order for a demonstration to be effective they could not allow this to happen. There are also plans to hand out leaflets at the bus depot and airport but no date has been set for this activity.

The meeting closed at 11:00 P.M. and the chairman took along approximately 500 leaflets for delivery to Southfield, no further information.
