# Two Held in Attack on Police Officers

Ivery Thomas, 17, of 3917 Townsend, was arrested Tuesday and held for resisting an officer in the performance of his duty.

Patrolman Raymond Schuholz, 38, said he had stopped Thomas to give him a ticket for a pedestrian violation at Meldrum and Mack and Thomas refused to identify himself.

As Schuholz was attempting to put Thomas in the police car, Thomas kicked him in the midsection and another youth, 17 or 18, 6 feet 2, and weighing approximately 150 pounds, wearing a black Eisenhower-type jacket, black pants and bubble-type sun glasses, struck Schuholz in the back with an unknown object.

A crowd of approximately 20 or 30 persons gathered around the police car, but when police arrived, the crowd dispersed. Thomas suffered a lump on the head and was given first aid at Receiving hospital. Patrolman Schuholz was treated for a wound in the back and abrasions of the ribs.

In a similar case, Harry D. Palmer, 32, of 626 Smith, was arrested Friday and held a prisoner at Receiving hospital on charges of assault and battery on a policeman.

Patrolman Herbert Talbot, 23, said he was patrolling his beat and saw Palmer stagger across Hamilton, near Collingwood, interfering with traffic.

Talbot stopped Palmer, identified himself, and asked Palmer to give him some identification. Talbot said

Palmer refused to identify himself, and struck the officer in the face with his fist. Talbot then hit Palmer with his nightstick, wrestled the prisoner to the ground and attempted to handcuff him. Talbot requested bystanders to call police and three scout cars responded.
