Ronald said that the police had hurt his arm when they pulled him out of bed. Subject stated that she called the Police Commissioner and they refused to let subject talk with her children, Subject also called Judge Lincoln but received no service. Subject states that she called and talked with Ned Droper and he said that Judge Lincoln was the only one that could help her and that he had said that anytime the Braxton boys were picked up hold them.
