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- A Almost everyday.
- Q Visit James Henderson?
- A I have; on occasion I have.

(MR. CROSS REQUESTS RIGHT TO RECALL WITNESS)

THE COUPT: Very well.

(Mr. Schwartzback requests calling of next witness)

(JOHN LEE WAS CALLED AS A WITNESS, AND DULY SWORN)

DIRECT EXAMINATION

MR. SCHWARTZBACH:

- Q Witness, would you state your name, please?
- A Johnny Henry Lee.
- Q How old are you, Mr. Lee?
- A Be 30 in June.
- Q Are you married or single?
- A Married.
- Q Any children?
- A Two.
- Q Do you recall, sir, the date of July 5th, 1971?
- A Yes, I do.
 - Q Where did you live on that date, sir?
- A 40 Charlotte; Foster Hotel.
- Q 40 Charlotte; Foster Hotel. Direct your attention, sir, specifically to the evening of July 5th, 1971; the hours of

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1		11:30 P.M. to 12:00 midnight. Do you recall that time, sir?
2	A	Yes.
3	Q	Did anything unusual occur at that time, sir?
4	A	Yes. It was it was hot that night. I was working on the
5		desk, and I come on the outside, you know, and I see these
6		two officers walking down the street pass Foster's; and they
7		was plain, you know; and they were going towards Woodward.
8	Q	That is on the north side of Charlotte?
9	A	Yes.
10	Q	They were walking toward Woodward. Please continue.
11	A	Right; And one of them had a sack in his hand.
12		MR. CROSS: Had a what, sir?
13		WITNESS:
14	A	Sack.
15		MR. COCKRELL: S-A-C-K; paper sack.
16		WITNESS:
17	A	Containing something. Anyway, they went all the way down
18		to Woodward.
19	Q	Did you see those men again that evening?
20	A	Yes.
21	Q	Where were they again?
22	A	Then they were coming back.
23	Q	Both on the same side of the street?
24	A	Split.
25	Q	They were split up? One on the north side, and one on the

south side?

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A Right.

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Q And they were walking back toward Park?

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A Right.

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Q What did you see happen then, sir?

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One was on the other side of the street; that's the south side of Foster's. He was walking along in there by the garage there and he was stopped by three men who was coming the other

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way.

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Q By "stopped", do you mean physically stopped or just stopped

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Yes, just stopped in conversation.

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Q Fine. What happened then, sir?

in conversation?

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A And they stood there about two to three seconds, and the officer left; went on down the street; and--(Interpose)

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Q Did they come in contact with him again?

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A Well, three guys, they turned around and went down behind him, and he was stopped again down there.

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Fine. By "stopped", you mean conversation?

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A Conversation.

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Q What did you see happen then, sir?

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A Well they stood there for a minute or so, and he stepped back and through his stepping back, he was drawing, and

started firing.

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He drew a gun and started firing?

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- A Right.
- Q Fine, sir. When you saw these three negro males walking west--east on Charlotte in the direction of that white officer, did you see a weapon in the hands of any of those three men?
- A No. I didn't.
- Q When those three men walked back toward that white officer, did you see a weapon in the hands of any of those three men?
- A No.

MR. CROSS: Your Honor --

WITNESS:

A No.

MR. CROSS: (Object to characterization of "officer", etc.)

(COURTS RULING)

MR. SCHWARTZBACH:

- When that officer backed up and pulled a gun and started firing, did you see a weapon in the hands of any of those three men?
- A No, I didnt.
- Q At the time that that officer backed up and started firing, were these men running away, or were they standing still?
- A The one that I could see more, after the first shot was fired(Interpose)
- Q At the time the shot was fired, were they standing still or

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running?

- A They was standing still.
- Q Fine. And did you see what those men did after the shooting started?
- A Well, the tall one, he ran between the officer and the other two.
- Q Fine. And he ran in which direction?
- A Well, it's an empty lot there, and he kind of made--as like he was going in there, then he cut across and ran over to the store over there.
- Q Is that again, Leadbetter's (phonetic) store, on the northwest corner of Charlotte and Park?
- A Right.
- Q Did you see what the other two men did?
- A Well they stood there for a second, then they started -turned around and started running down the alley.
- Q There is an alley next to Malcom's Transmission?
- A Right.
- Q And they ran south, is that correct?
- A Right.
- Q Did you ever go to the mouth of the alley after the shooting stopped?
- A Yes.
- Q Did you look down that alley?
- A Yes.

- Q Did you see those men?
- A No, I didn't.
- Q After you saw those two men run down that alley, did you even see them again, alive?
- A No, I didn't.
- Q No, you didn't. Thank you, sir. No further questions.
 Your witness.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. CROSS:

- o Mr. Lee?
- A Yes.

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- Q Do you live in the area now?
- A No, I don't.
- Q Did you live in that area then?
- A Yes, I did.
- Q How long ago was it that you moved?
- A Well, that was quite a while ago. That was about--Um--about four months after this happened.
- Q And this was July, 1971?
- A Um Hum. (Nodding affirmatively)
- Q That means you would have moved sometime around November of 1971?
- A Yes; somewhere around there.
- Q Did you have any particular reason why you moved?
- A Well, my cousin, she owned a building; a house; and she

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
