Second Ave. and 490 Selden and had three breaking and enterings in less than a week. Mr. Chance concluded by saying he made three (3) reports at the Thirteenth precinct.

Commissioner Williams stated that many of the complaints mentioned this evening will receive attention from the precinct and Western Operations District. He also questioned the idea of sixty-five (65) officers being assigned to the Fox Theater. He further explained the process of telephone crime reporting and how it freed up officers allowing them to respond to crimes in progress.

Bishop Grover Wimbley, Pastor of the Church at Post and South Streets, stated the Church operates a soup kitchen daily. He commended the Fourth precinct officers and advised that people must watch out for one another not just sit in their homes and talk about moving from Detroit. You cannot avoid trouble by moving, crime is everywhere.

Amatullah Abaduqadir advised that in her area they bug the police for everything. "They respond because we call for everything", she stated.

Female who did not give her name, stated they needed special attention between the hours of 3:00 a.m. to 6:30 a.m. in the area of Woodmere to Livernois between Fort and Dix because of crime and disturbances.

James White complained that thugs broke his church's window at 3:00 a.m. and inquired if the police would respond when they are called.

Blanca Evaluosos, has lived in the Southwest area for thirty (30) years, stated she has been threatened that she would be shot by the Cobra gang. Ms. Evaluosos said she cannot sleep due to her fear.

Ms. Evaluosos was advised that Officer Lott would make a report.
