On March 15, 1968, at approximately 11:45 A.M. I received a phone call from Conrad Mallett asking me to go to Post Junior School as he had gotten word that trouble to be anticipated.

I immediately left the Housing Commission and when I arrived at Post 5. His Jr. High School I saw one police car record on Greenlawn south of the school. I did not notice any other police car in the vicinity. I then went into the school and proceeded directly into the office.

In the office there was the inspector from the 12th Precinct and A Board or Ed.

3 other uniformed officers. I identified myself to the school's

administrator and asked if there had been any trouble. The answer was

"no" but if there was going to be any trouble they expected it to

occur in a few minutes after class changed.

When the bell rang, I went out into the hallway and the kids were shouting and making an unusual amount of noise but was pretty much going to their classes. The teachers and other school officials were having some degree of success with getting them in the classes until was serope the fire alarmed. This, of course, caused the kids to run, shout and go out of doors.

I then went back into the office and talked to a Dr. _____a

female administrator from the Board of Education and asked her if

there was really a fire. She said she did not think so but doubted

if there was a fire. In all like one of the students had set off the

alarm. I asked here where were the alarms located in the building.

She said that they were located in various places throughout the building.

I then asked her had they designated some of the staff to maned some

the alarms so that the students don't set off the alarms she became

upset and said they didn't have staff to do this.

I then preceded to go outside because I sale the students were dial.

Tactical policemen began to appear. The fire trucks came. The firemen went inside the building and did their usual routine and within a few minutes they came back out and got in their vehicles and started to leave.

As they were leaving some of the students outside began to throw snowballs in the fire trucks. The last fire truck to leave stopped and the fireman with the No. L24 on his helmet jumped off the truck ran into the crowd and proceeded beating on the students. This, of course, caused extreme excitement and the youngsters started to crowd around the fireman and the young boy. The police then moved in the scuffle and the youngster was seized by them and was being roughlup by a police no. Badge 2606.

This same policeman and also shove Led Mrs. James Garrett as she tried to aid in bring order on the scene. This same treatment was accordance by this same policeman by Rev. Craid Head of 10600 Puritan who is a Presbyterian minister.

This officer's actions were extremely abusive. All but approximately 300 of the youngsters who were outside the school gradually left the school area. Approximately 300 youngseter was collected in small groups on Greenlawn along the east side of the school. They were clustered in small groups malling around shouting, throwing a few snowballs and general marker. Generally be naving in an on why Manner

The police then designed they would dispers the young ters and clear the streets. They formed a line reaching sidewalk to sidewalk and proceeded to move northward on Greenlawn.

One of the youngseers exactly was not moving fast enough to suit a police officer and he was knocked down by two of the police officers; officers number 1301 kicked the youngster while he was down. The youngster in no way resisted. He only infractors seem to be not swiftly enough when the officer gave him orders to move out.

I was also told to move out and when I mentioned to this same officer I was representative of the Mayor's office, he told me if I was going to stay around there I should get the youngster back in school.

As the police proceeded to forced the remaining kids northward, on Greenlawn I walked down Greenlawn behind them. I notice one of the police officers walk up to a young white man walking along with the students and whose back was to the police officers get shove determined almost down by one of the officers. After the man recovered his balance he continued to walk along and as near as I can tell did not respond to the police. This same man was almost shove down at least 3 times before they reached Puritan. The officer who did this had Badge No.

The police continued their sweep all the way up to Puritan and for one block east of Greenlawn forcing everyone in front of them to move.

I stopped to try to pursuade some of the youngsters to move before they eeul- got hurt and was again challenged by officers Nos. 575 and 270.

I again identified myself as a representative from the Mayor's office and was told by them that they didn't give a damn and that they had orders to clear the streets.

I noticed that several of the officers did not have their complete badge number on their shields of their chests. I'm wondering if this,

were disper, without further incident and I left the scene.
