"I just about died when that gun pointed at me," says United Press International photographer Daniel Dmitruk. But he pursued the action doggedly — "within five feet," he says — clicking through a roll of film to capture a second-by-second account of the brief scuffle between picketing police officers in front of the Federal Building in Detroit yesterday. "I was at the Federal Building shooting pictures of the demonstrating officers when I saw this black officer (William Green) run across Lafayette to a parking lot," says Dmitruk. At that point fellow off-duty officers beat and kicked Green to

the ground. As he got up, Green pulled his gun, holding it by the barrel as a club. When the other officers seized him, he gripped the pistol as though to shoot it but was quickly wrestled to the ground and it was confiscated.
