

# FEDERAL OVERSIGHT

## NOVEMBER 2000

The Department of Justice (DOJ) starts an investigation into the Detroit Police Department (DPD) pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 14141

## JUNE 12, 2003

Civil Rights Division of the US Department of Justice files U.S. v. City of Detroit

## JULY 1, 2003

Federal courts deny the Detroit Coalition Against Police Brutality's (DCAPB) motion to intervene.

## JULY 18, 2003

DPD is placed under two consent decrees: "Use of Force and Arrest and Witness Detention" and "Conditions of Confinement"

## DECEMBER 27, 2004

Judge Cook extends "Conditions of Confinement" consent decree to July 18, 2011

## OCTOBER 26, 2007

Judge Cook extends "Use of Force and Arrest and Witness Detention" until July 18, 2011

## JANUARY 27, 2014

Judge Cook dismisses the Conditions of Confinement Consent Decree

## AUGUST 25, 2014

Judge Cohn dismisses the Use of Force and Arrest and Witness Detention consent decree

## MARCH 31, 2016

Judge Cook ends federal oversight of the Detroit Police Department
