Note On Pay Rate: Rate represents minimum salary. There will be an annual increase effective January 1993.

LAST DATE TO FILE APPLICATION: Applications may be filed until further notice. This examination may be closed at the discretion of the Department of Personnel/Human Resources with notice being posted in the office of the Department three weeks prior to closing date.

QUALIFICATIONS

At the time of application and appointment, applicants must:

1. Be citizens of the United States;
2. Have passed their 18th birthday;
3. Be a high school graduate or the equivalent;
4. Qualify for appointment as a Deputy Sheriff (this requires one year of continuous residence in the State of Michigan immediately preceding appointment);
5. Qualify for a permit to carry firearms;
6. Have a valid Michigan Driver's License and a good driving record; AND
7. Have passed the Michigan Law Enforcement Officers Training Council's (MLEOTC) police tests for reading and writing and physical skills. (Applicants must submit proof of satisfactory completion of the MLEOTC police pre-employment test battery with their applications or the applications will be rejected.)

NOTE: A FELONY CONVICTION WILL IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFY THE APPLICANT. APPLICANTS CURRENTLY CERTIFIED AS LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS BY THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY AND ARE NOT REQUIRED TO TAKE THE MLEOTC PRE-EMPLOYMENT TEST BATTERY. PROOF OF CURRENT CERTIFICATION MUST BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION (Information regarding scheduling of MLEOTC test may be obtained upon request.)

APPOINTEES MUST ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN WAYNE COUNTY RESIDENCY DURING THE PERIOD OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Under the direction or supervision of a Command Officer, Police Officers perform professional police work in the Wayne County Sheriff's Department. They may be assigned to the Wayne County Jail Division, Field Services, Airport or Court Services Divisions. Functions include, but are not limited to: booking, searching and guarding prisoners; maintaining order and guarding Judges and juries; providing building security at County facilities; serving Civil Process, tracing persons, making arrests and performing numerous and diverse Law Enforcement duties as requested. With appropriate training, Officers in this classification perform many specialized duties including fingerprint classifications, crime-scene photography, polygraph examinations, teletype duties and mounted and marine functions. Some positions receive additional skills compensation.

TYPES OF TESTS

Personal qualifications and related factors (interview) will be rated at (70%). Experience will be worth (15%). Higher education will be worth (15%). This examination will also include a personal attitudinal factors test and a MEDICAL EXAMINATION. This examination will also include a pre-employment Drug Screen which the applicant must pass.
