Detroiter found slain in home

Detroit police are investigating the stabbing death of a 25-year-old west side man.

Leroy Turner of 1953 Seward was found yesterday lying in a rear room of his home, stabbed 11 times in the back, according to police.

Police said Turner's body was found at 6:46 p.m. by his mother, Jessie, who had gone to Turner's home for a visit.

Turner was last seen alive on Saturday and police said he had probably been dead for two or three days.

Sgt. Robert Brown of the police Homicide Section said the death appeared to be narcotics-related because the apartment had been ransacked and drug paraphernalia was found inside the apartment.

dispatcher at the main post office at 1401 Fort, was shot in the left arm at 9:50 p.m. yesterday. Bradley was listed in serious condition this morning in Detroit General Hospital.

Police said they were holding Bradley, the shooting victim, as a police prisoner and planned to file a charge against him.

According to police, Bradley was shot during a struggle at the post office with Jeffrey Clyburn, a policeman from the 10th (Livernois) Precinct.

Police said Clyburn's sister, Julliette Clyburn, 25, of Taylor, works as a clerk at the main post office and apparently had disagreements with Bradley.

Yesterday, Miss Clyburn called her brother at home and complained of troubles with Bradley, police said.

Clyburn went to the post office and the three met outside, where both Bradley and Clyburn pulled out guns, police said.

During a struggle between the two men Clyburn's gun fired, striking Bradley, according to police. Another gun was found at the scene. It had not been fired, police said.

Clyburn has been a Detroit police officer since June 16, 1977.
